Dear Parents/Carers,

We hope you all had a lovely Christmas. Welcome back to the new Spring term. Please find below some helpful information about our learning over this term.

### PE:

PE Days remain the same on a Wednesday and Friday. Please can your child wear their PE kit to school on these days.

### What will my child be learning? Spring Curriculum Coverage:

Our theme this half term is '**A Long Time Ago.**' During our theme, we will be exploring events and objects from the past. This will include, revisiting learning about themselves as babies and using a timeline to plot events that happened a long time ago. We will talk about dinosaurs and whether the world looked different then. We will also talk about how artefacts have changed over time, such as telephones, televisions and computers. Our focus book 'Lost and Found' will start conversations about Antarctica and the Arctic.

During Spring 2 our topic will be '**All Creatures Great and Small.**' We will talk a lot about lifecycles and farming. We have our visit planned to support this theme at Launceston Farm.
